

Polar Plunge Captain Information and Resources

Steps to Creating a Team:

1. Go to www.plungeks.org and find your city!
2. Click on the Register link. You will be taken to the online registration page.
3. Click on Register and choose how you will be joining (joining a team, creating a team, or fundraising on your own)
4. Create (or log in to) your own account and hit the next button.
5. Set your fundraising goal and then complete the online registration form, agree to our waiver by clicking the box, and hit the green button next. Your goal must be at least \$100.
6. That's it - you're registered! Feel free to customize your page by writing your story and uploading unique photos.

FAQs:

How can my company participate?

Companies can participate by organizing teams of employees to raise funds to plunge in the event and/or be a corporate sponsor.

Is it difficult to organize a team?

Not all all! There are several brave souls who will take the plunge for Special Olympics – it is fun and daring! Appoint a team captain and promote the event to your company/organization.

How many people do we need for a team?

There is no minimum and there is no maximum! The more plungers are on a team, the more fun your group will have! The minimum entry fee is number of plungers x \$100.

Is the team limited to company employees?

Of course not! Team participation is open to everyone. Employees are encouraged to invite their family, friends and neighbors to be involved. This is a great opportunity to bring co-workers and their families together outside of their office for the purpose of helping others.

Does having a team require some kind of corporate donation?

While corporate donations are not required, they are beneficial. Team members generate the majority of the total dollars raised by the team; however corporate matching gifts only heighten employee fundraising efforts. Be sure to ask your employer if they have a matching gifts program – you can double your money by just asking!

How do we raise money?

Ask family, friends, neighbors and businesses you frequent to support you. You can also ask those employees who do not plunge to participate by making a monetary contribution. Explore matching gift opportunities. Have all your plungers join your team and set-up their own fundraising page at plungeks.org. Place a collection jar in a common area for spare change contributions in support of your Plunge Team. Some businesses allow employees to “dress down” for a fee and use the money raised to support the Plunge Team. Encourage friendly competition!

How can management help with building a company team?

Management can encourage team participation in a number of ways, including: signing up for the team themselves; drafting and distributing a company-wide memo or email endorsing the Polar Bear Plunge; authorizing company –wide recruitment meetings; recognize top performers and your team captain with an incentives lunch with teammates and making a personal donation to the team.

Can we have more than one team captain?

Yes! Your company can create friendly competition among departments or branch sites by recruiting a team captain from each department or floor. This is a great way to generate enthusiasm and friendly competition for a worthy cause.

Can someone talk to our team about the Polar Plunge?

Yes, Special Olympics Kansas has several staff members and volunteers that would be more than happy to talk about the Polar Plunge! In addition, we have Special Olympics athletes trained as Global Messengers who would enjoy the opportunity to talk about Special Olympics.

What are the requirements to Plunge?

All participants must raise a minimum of \$100, complete a registration form and sign a waiver and wear shoes!

Do we have to dress in costumes?

Absolutely not, but it does help create team excitement and there is an award for Team Best Costume!

What are my responsibilities as team captain?

Prior to event:

- Responsible for recruiting plungers for your team. This can include family, friends, company employees, etc. Spread the word by asking members of your company, organization, family and friends to take the plunge with you!
- Select a *cool* Team Name
- Set a team fundraising goal
- Decide on costumes for your team (optional)
- Make sure all your team members set up a fundraising page and enter your team name.
- Keep team members engaged and motivated with weekly updates, memos or emails.

How do I recruit team members?

- Spread the word and generate enthusiasm about the event and periodically announce team progress.
- Hang up signs and posters in your company work/lunch room.
- Special Olympics Kansas can hold an informal meeting with members of your company, organization or group.
- Encourage co-works and other group members to invite their family and friends to participate.
- Send recruitment letter or email to everyone you know.
